## NOTES FOR MUSICIAN.

A metronome figure will be found with each tune. These figures give the times of the dances ordinarily taken by the Morris-men themselves, and may therefore be called the true times.

After playing the Once-to-yourself, which precedes every dance, the musician goes on without pause to play the dance music. Therefore, before starting, the player must see that the dancers are in their places and ready to begin.

Where hand-strokes occur in a dance, the notes upon which they fall are marked in the music, thus $\mathbf{O}$.
