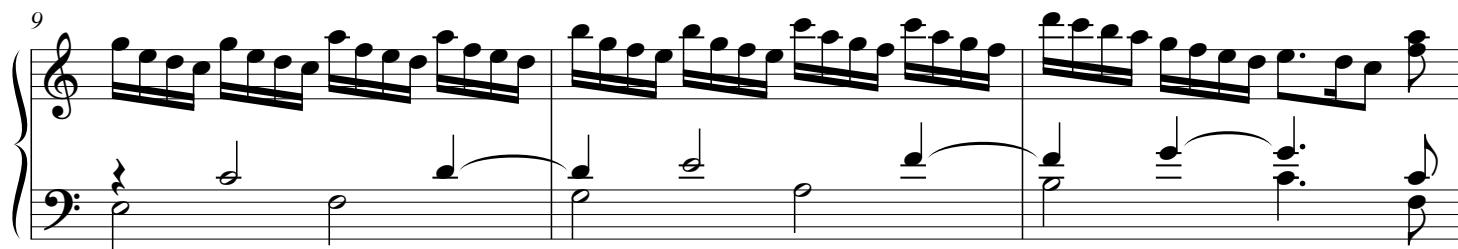
Adagio

The Adagio section is written for organ in 3/4 time. It consists of five systems of music. The first system (measures 1-6) features a treble staff with chords and a bass staff with a simple harmonic accompaniment. The second system (measures 7-12) introduces a more active treble line with eighth-note patterns and trills, while the bass staff continues with sustained notes.
