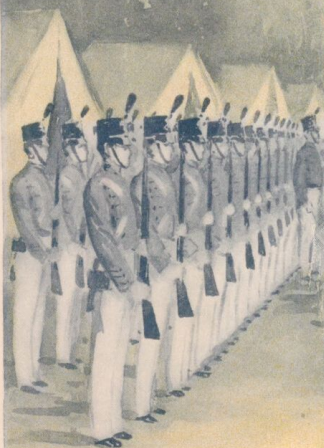

Piano.

The piano introduction is in 3/4 time, key of D major. It begins with a strong *f* (forte) chord in the right hand and a bass line in the left hand. Voice
