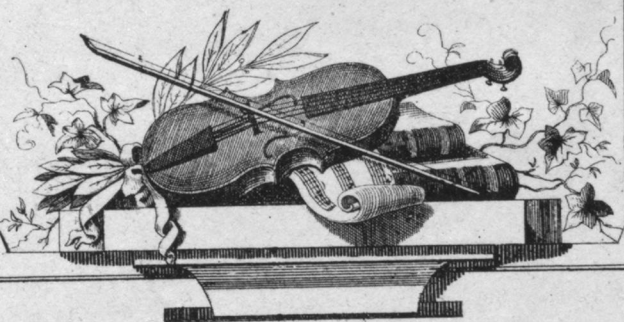

Larghetto.

Violon. Larghetto. *mf*
